The Riverside County Santa Ana River Watershed (SARW) Stormwater Resource Plan (SWRP) Stakeholder Meeting #2 was opened by Andrea Macias from the Riverside County Flood Control and Water Conservation District (RCFC&WCD) and led by Brenda Ponton from Woodard & Curran (W&C). Details on materials presented and talking points are not provided here as they are available in the meeting presentation.

1. SWRP OVERVIEW

Brenda Ponton provided an overview of SWRPs, including their purpose, goals and objectives, and major components, as well as an overview of the SARW SWRP Planning Area. The SARW SWRP website is now live and will be continuously updated to provide information on the SARW SWRP and opportunities for stakeholder engagement. Stakeholder meeting agendas and presentation materials, the Project Submittal Form, the SARW SWRP project list, and the final SARW SWRP will all be posted to the website when available. Brenda also reviewed the SARW SWRP schedule, which includes three stakeholder meetings tentatively scheduled for January 19th, February 16th, and May 4th, 2022. The final SARW SWRP is anticipated by late summer 2022.

2. SWRP PROJECT SOLICITATION

Brenda Ponton provided an overview of the SWRP project solicitation process and the upcoming Proposition 1 Round 2 Integrated Regional Water Management (IRWM) Implementation Grant opportunity. Brenda also provided an overview of SWRP project eligibility, example SWRP projects that have received State funding, and the SWRP project solicitation process. The SWRP call for projects is open now through March 25, 2022. Stakeholders who want to add a project to the SARW SWRP should submit a completed Project Submittal Form to Andrea Macias at almacias@rivco.org.

- Rae Beimer: What is the funding cap for a public agency project?



- Brenda Ponton: There is no maximum cost requirement for projects that will be included in the SARW SWRP. The Proposition 1 Round 2 IRWM Implementation Grant has a different project submittal form and scoring process. Please check the Santa Ana Watershed Protection Agency's (SAWPA's) website for more information on requirements for that grant program.

3. SWRP PROJECT PRIORITIZATION

Brenda Ponton presented an overview of the criteria for project prioritization, including SWRP main and additional benefits, project feasibility, watershed priorities, and quantified benefits.

4. NEXT STEPS

Brenda Ponton presented the next steps for the SARW SWRP. The SARW SWRP call for projects is open now through March 25, 2022. The Project Submittal Forms and backup documentation should be submitted to Andrea Macias at almacias@rivco.org. The call for projects for the IRWM Implementation Grant is also open; please submit eligible projects to the SAWPA (<https://sawpa.org/owow/future-funding-opportunities/>). The next stakeholder meeting is scheduled for Wednesday, May 4th from 2-3 pm to discuss the prioritized project list and SWRP implementation.

5. QUESTIONS

- Lynn Merrill: Is there a restriction on how many projects can be submitted by a single agency?
 - Brenda Ponton: No, agencies can submit as many projects as they want to include in the SARW SWRP. The only restriction is whether they meet the eligibility requirements.
- Amy McNeill: Clarification that submitting a project to the SARW SWRP does not mean the project will be part of a funding application, but it will make the project eligible for funding.
- Darcy Kuenzi: Can wet weather projects be included?
 - Brenda Ponton: Yes, both wet weather and dry weather projects will be included in the SWRP.
